SAFEGUARDING OUR FEMINIST GAINS IN THE GLOBAL HIV RESPONSE AND CO-CREATING GENDER TRANSFORMATIVE COVID-19 RECOVERY STRATEGIES

The Women's Networking Zone (WNZ) is a space hosted and convened at the global AIDS Conferences and other global policy spaces in the Global HIV response. WNZ has been nurtured over time through cross movement collaboration between networks of women living with HIV and other women's rights groups. The WNZ is a vibrant, inclusive, and exciting space where community members, policy-analysts, advocates. decision-makers, service-providers, and researchers share and learn. WNZ also creates space for community building, safe space, and strategizing. The WNZ promotes dialogue, strengthens existing links and forges new networks, raises the visibility of HIV, champions the leadership of women living with HIV in all their diversity (with an emphasis on young women and women from the local community), and promotes the

global exchange of experiences, abilities, and knowledge. Now more than ever when rights are under attack and gains at risk, when adolescent women and girls continue to bear the burden of the HIV pandemic, and when HIV prevention tools for women and girls continue to be lacking adequate funding, these kinds of spaces, that nurture feminist movement building, thought leadership and create spaces of solidarity, are needed.

The WNZ2022 planning team aims to create a WNZ space that will be a community-focused forum with a full program of workshops and power hour forums, feminist o'clock, strategy sessions, and networking moments.

At AIDS2022, WNZ will be monumental, given that it will be the first hybrid AIDS Conference since the

beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the WNZ2022 was almost not hosted, but was reinstated after rigorous and concerted advocacy from feminist groups, networks of women living with HIV and allies to persuade the IAS leadership to reconsider their decision, having rejected two WNZ proposals.

Having been reinstated and confirmed as part of the Global Village at the AIDS 2022 conference, WNZ2022 is envisioned to be the core and heartbeat of feminist organizing and movement building at AIDS 2022. ATHENA Network and the International Community of Women living with HIV Eastern Africa (ICWEA) representing the ICW family will be co-convening the WNZ2022 alongside other partners guiding the process through a global WNZ Planning Committee.

OVERALL GOAL



To build strong partnerships with feminist groups, women's rights organizations, networks of women living with HIV, young women-led and young feminist networks and organizations that work on SRHR, stigma and discrimination, GBV, gender inequality and human rights at all levels to hold governments, donors, bi-lateral and multi-lateral agencies accountable on the commitments made to the six Generation Equality Forum Action Coalitions; Ending AIDS by 2030 and Achieving the goals and objectives of the UNAIDS Gender Action Plan 2018 – 2023; and SDGs 2030 and the AIDS Global Strategy.

OBJECTIVES



To analyze the challenges, opportunities and trends within the HIV and women's rights movements due to COVID-19 pandemic and opportunities for women and girls in their diversity to play a key role in COVID-19 recovery efforts



To create a vibrant cross-movement, cross- and inter-generational safe space where girls and women in all their diversity dialogue, share information, exchange knowledge, skills and experiences, strategize, and network to accelerate advocacy of universal access to HIV-, SRHR- and other services among women in diversity



To link evidence to policy and legal standards, practice, funding, and advocacy on SRHR, gender and human rights to catalyze and accelerate implementation of commitments made to end HIV-related stigma and discrimination



To articulate the strategies needed to safeguard feminist gains in the Global HIV response and during COVID-19 pandemic

EXPECTED OUTCOME(S)



→ A manifesto reflecting the analysis and thought leadership from deliberations during various sessions at the WNZ and the entire AIDS2022 conference and to serve as a collective advocacy roadmap for feminist demands in the HIV response & COVID-19 recovery path.



Partnerships and solidarity among women-led networks and organisations strengthened for movement building in the HIV response



Improved knowledge and capacity among women and girls to hold duty bearers accountable for commitments towards ending the HIV epidemic and related stigma, discrimination and GBV among women and girls in their diversity



→ Feminist organizing and movement building within the AIDS Conference safeguarded
